Maritime Pilotage (Amendment) Regulations 2015

The Authority for Transport in Malta wishes to notify that the Maritime Pilotage Regulations (S.L. 499.26) have been amended in terms of Legal Notice 201 of 2015 as published in the Government Gazette No 19,441 of 16 June of 2015.

The amendment prescribes that the discount of 50% on the second pilot tariff shall be deleted and therefore such discount is no longer applicable. Although, the Legal Notice prescribes that the amendment comes into force on 1st June of 2015, an agreement has been reached with the Malta Maritime Pilots to apply as from Monday, 22nd June of 2015.

AUTHORITY FOR TRANSPORT IN MALT ACT (CAP. 499)

PORTS AND SHIPPING ACT (CAP. 352)

Maritime Pilotage (Amendment) Regulations, 2015

IN exercise of the powers conferred by article 43(3) of the Authority for Transport in Malta Act and article 27 of the Ports and Shipping Act, the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure, in consultation with the Authority for Transport in Malta and in concurrence with the Minister for Finance, has made the following regulations:

Citation and commencement. S.L. 499.26

- 1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Maritime Pilotage (Amendment) Regulations, 2015 and they shall be read and construed as one with the Maritime Pilotage Regulations, 2003, hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations".
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st June, 2015.

Amends the Schedule to the principal regulations.

2. The second proviso to paragraph 18 of the Schedule to the principal regulations shall be deleted.
